



April 1st is an upcoming deadline for some universities, but students are encouraged to complete their own research as deadlines and criteria differ based on each university, faculty, department, and program. The Guidance department has been communicating this importance message with students since September as well as at our one-on-one meetings and workshops throughout the school year. remember that students who have studied at Bronte College for 3 or 4 years could have their English proficiency exempted, but that should have already been communicated to them by the university.
