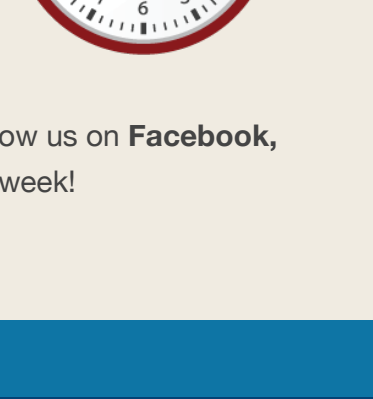




Dear Bronte Community,

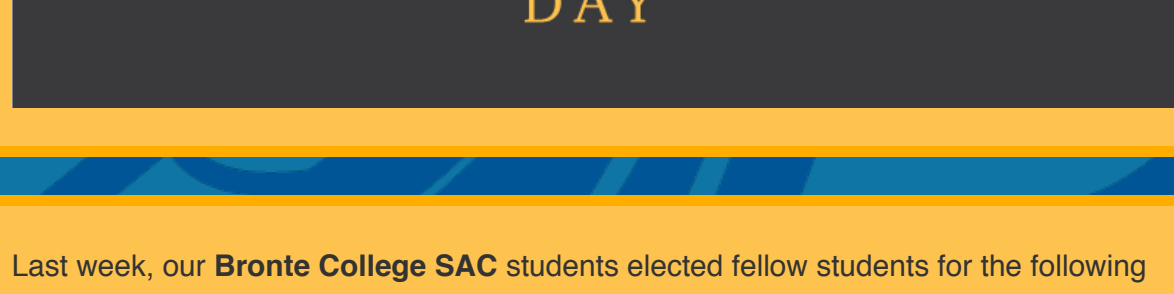

WHAT'S HAPPENING ON CAMPUS

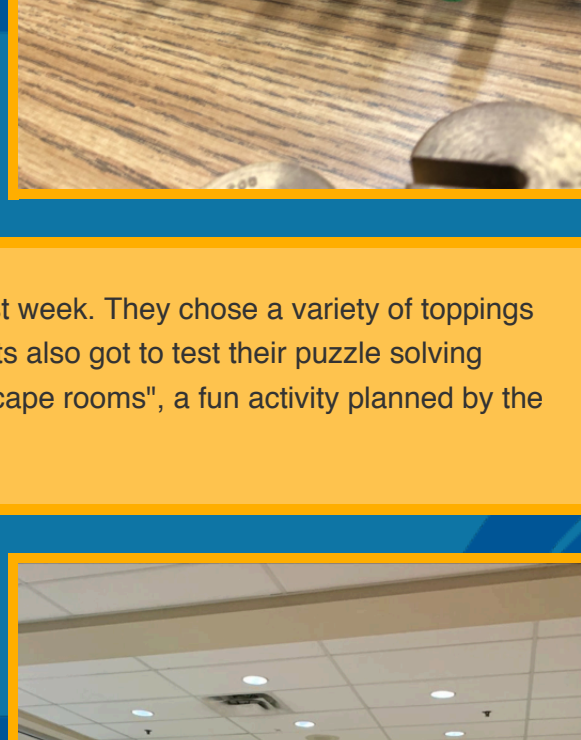
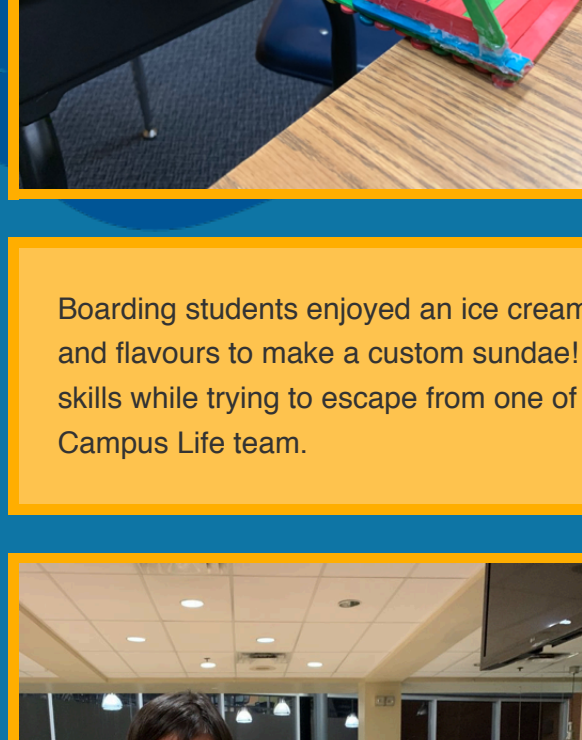
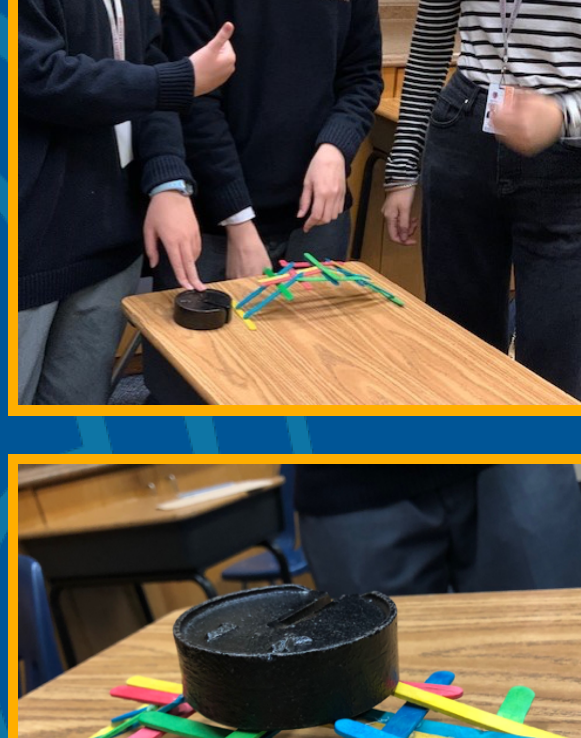

GUIDANCE NEWS

Monday **November 15th** is the **Full Disclosure Date**. This means students are able to drop a class without the mark appearing on their official transcripts. To drop a course, students must talk to their guidance counsellors first. The guidance team must also receive an email before **4pm on Monday November 15th** from your parents giving you permission to drop the course. Please remember that there is no money given back for the course you drop as the refund date has passed. It is important to note that dropping certain courses can impact your graduation date, university application, and timetable.
