Travelling for the Holidays?



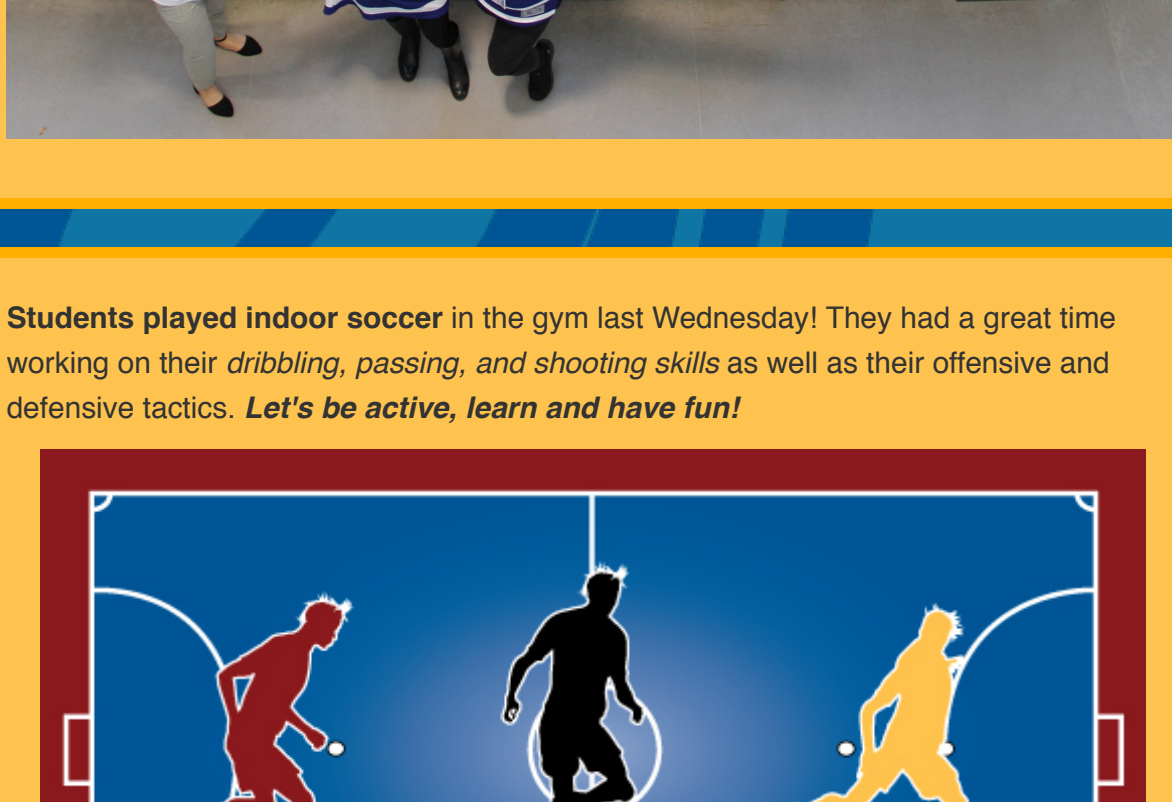

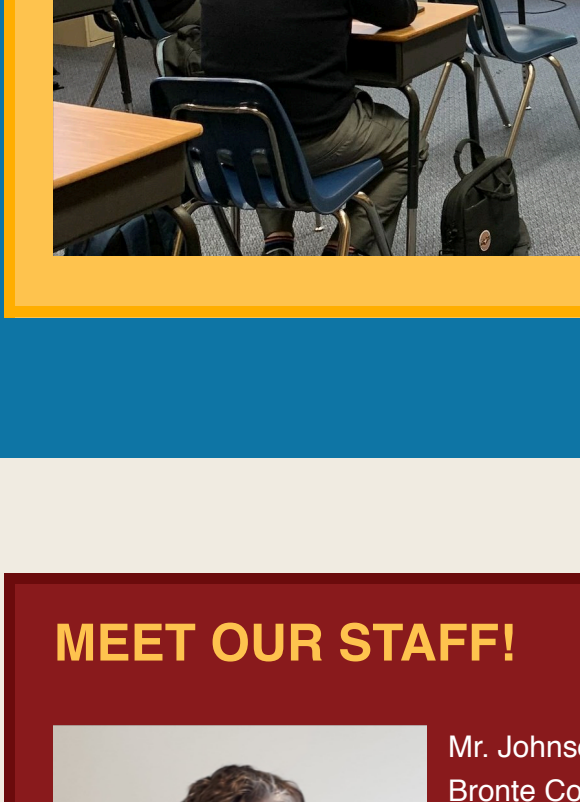

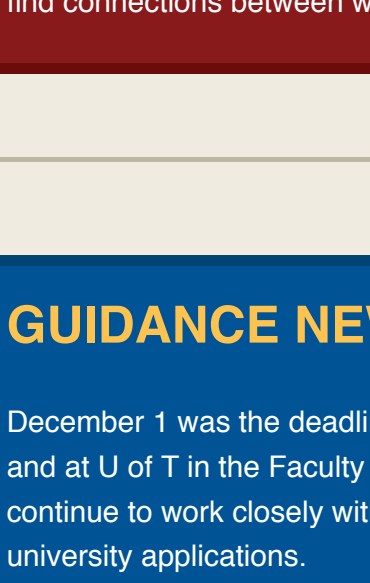
