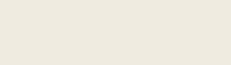
Our students learned how to make Mac & Cheese completely from scratch, adding their personal touches. A delicious lesson indeed!



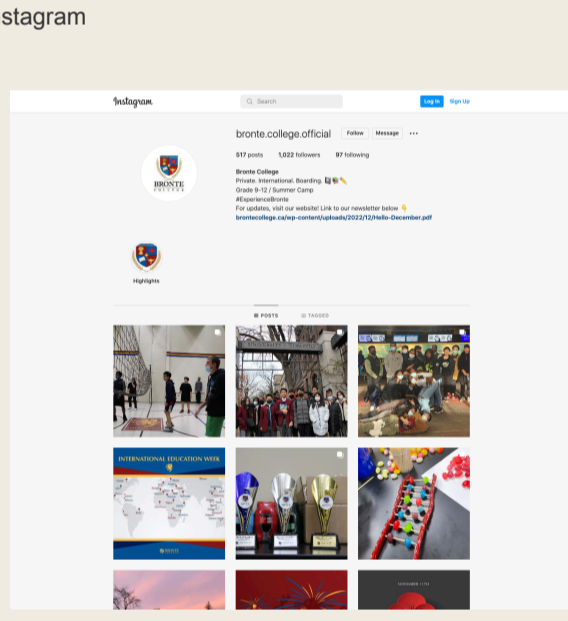
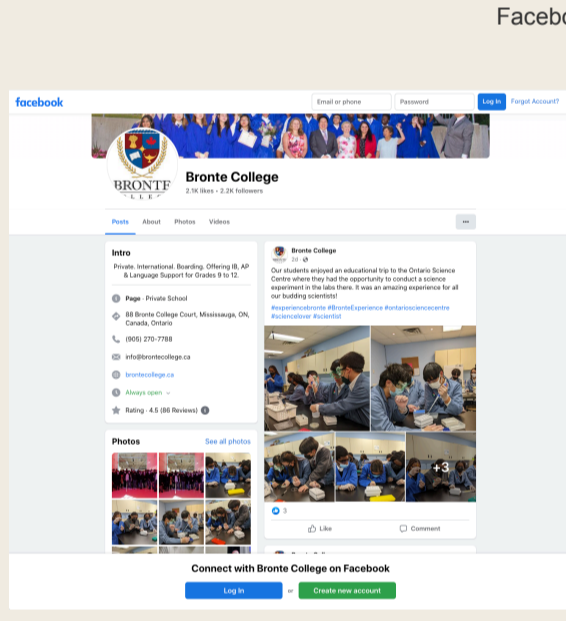

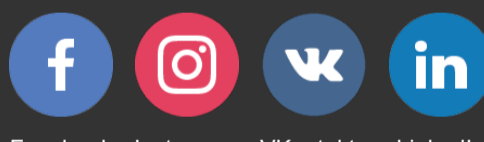
