WHO WE ARE



Bronte College strives to create exciting academic programs that will assist students in their endeavour to access top schools around the world.


Bronte College encourages a collaborative learning environment that focuses on inquiry-based learning rather than fact memorization in all our classes. By satisfying the requirements of the Ontario Ministry of Education Curriculum guidelines, all Bronte students will graduate with an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) and have the option of writing Advanced Placement (AP) exams in Grade 12. Successful completion of AP exams enables students to earn university transfer credits. Enrichment programs include the Duke of Edinburgh Award program, and Bronte College's Express Program. All students benefit from our robust Academic Support Services, and an emphasis on Leadership Development. Additional options include English Second Language (ESL) courses, English Immersion camps and our popular summer camp program.

PROGRAMS

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)

At Bronte College, a challenging and inquiry-based curriculum is at the heart of our students' educational journey. Small class sizes ensure more personal attention from highly qualified teachers, and a collaborative learning environment provides students hands-on experience in problem-solving, teamwork and leadership. Bronte College students participate in a rigorous inquiry-based academic program, earning the internationally respected Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). To earn the OSSD, students must successfully complete 30 credits, which include compulsory courses and a range of elective options. The program encourages critical thinking, problem-solving, and effective communication skills, fostering a well-rounded education. Moreover, the OSSD equips students with the knowledge and skills necessary to further academic pursuits, while meeting the academic standards set by the Ministry of Education in Ontario, Canada.

Advanced Placement (AP)

The Advanced Placement (AP) program at Bronte College provides high school students with an exceptional opportunity to delve into college-level course material. Encompassing a diverse array of subjects, including mathematics, science, history, literature, and foreign languages, students receive comprehensive support, including course materials, one-on-one guidance, and dedicated teacher assistance. Additionally, specialized workshops are available in select subjects. AP exams are conveniently written on campus in May, as Bronte College is the regional AP Testing Centre. Participating in the AP program cultivates essential skills such as critical thinking, time management, and a robust work ethic—cornerstones for success in higher education. Moreover, the potential to earn credit through AP exams translates into tangible cost savings for parents, as it may enable students to earn first-year university transfer credits in advance.

English Support

To assist international students' transition from an ESL environment to a full academic program, students will be placed in our standard ESL program according to their pre-assessed level, in conjunction with other credit courses. Intermediate/advanced students will have the opportunity to improve their proficiency while working toward the completion of their Ontario Secondary School Diploma, while beginners will benefit from the additional opportunity to practise their English skills.

Express Program (Grade 12)

The Express Program at Bronte College offers students a fast-track route to university by earning six Grade 12 pre-university credits within a seven-month span—from December to June—while completing the requirements for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). Tailored for highly motivated students capable of excelling under an accelerated timetable, this intensive program includes individualized academic planning, university application support, after-school academic assistance, and guidance counselling.



WHAT DO I NEED TO GRADUATE

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)

Students who successfully complete high school are awarded the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) from the Ontario Ministry of Education. Students who have taken secondary school courses in another country will be offered equivalent credits based on the successful completion of those courses.

Become familiar with the requirements students must fulfil in order to graduate with an OSSD.



30 Credits

17 Compulsory Credits

- Examples of compulsory subject matter include English, Math, Science, History, Geography, Arts, Physical Education, Civics, Career Studies, Second Language, Technological Education (in grade 9 OR 10)

13 Optional Credits

- Students select these elective courses of various subject matter from our course calendar

Students must now earn a Technological Education Credit in Grade 9 or 10 as part of their high school diploma. Students will earn a total of 17 compulsory credits and 13 optional credits. This change will be phased in over the next several years.



OSSLT

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)

- Created and assessed by the EQAO (Education Quality and Accountability Office)
- Evaluates language skills based on the Ontario Curriculum's expectations at the Grade 9 level in the formal OSSLT online test
- Bronte College provides test preparation through the Head of Resources and Guidance Department
- Bronte College provides students with two opportunities a year to complete the test



40 Hours

Community Service

- May be completed at any time during their high school years

HOW TO APPLY

- 1. Apply online at www.brontecollege.ca. A photocopy of the applicant's passport, certified school reports or official transcripts for the past three years of education, as well as the non-refundable application fee (CAD \$300.00) must accompany the application form.
- 2. Upon receipt of these documents, the application will be reviewed. If the student is accepted, Bronte College will issue the student a Conditional Letter of Acceptance (CLOA), stating the program and fees payable.
- 3. Once payment is made to Bronte College, an official Letter of Acceptance and receipt of payment will be issued. International students can apply to the nearest Canadian Embassy or Consulate for a study permit.
- 4. For international students under 18 years of age, a signed Custodianship Consent Form must be provided by the parents or legal guardian, together with the non-refundable service fee of CAD \$300.00 for the preparation of a notarized Custodianship Declaration.

School transcripts and the completed application fee form can be emailed to admissions@brontecollege.ca

All new students are required to write the Bronte College Proficiency Tests in English, Mathematics and Science if applicable.
